<p>Nadine Tafoya and Associates Ann Del Vecchio, Ph.D.</p>	<p>“Native American Prevention Initiatives in New Mexico funded through NM/DOH/OSAP/VO”</p> <p>Highlights: Developed a manual: <u>Developing Substance Abuse Prevention Programs in New Mexico’s Native American Communities.</u>—Manual used in training events for 10 years. Note: 6 Native programs were funded for prevention in the state.</p> <p>Environmental strategies...changing community norms, policies and laws, etc. Direct services...evidence based model—Project Venture (Isleta Pueblo). Hands on learning model promoting leadership with teens. Mascarlero uses ‘Dare to be You’</p> <p>Findings, Native kids are most likely to receive prevention information (reduce violence, pregnancy, alcohol & increase positive action by youth) than Non-Native kids.</p> <p>PowerPoint presentation was provided to Coalition members.</p>
